## RATE ADJUSTMENT TO TAKE EFFECT JANUARY 2021

Clearwater-Polk Electric strives to provide economical and reliable energy services and is committed to delivering that reliable power at the lowest possible cost. Clearwater-Polk is accountable to our member-owners, not outside investors, and is a not-for-profit business.

### CLEARWATER-POLK ELECTRIC TRUST FUNDING AND DONATIONS

The Clearwater-Polk Electric Trust Fund committee is scheduled to meet in June for the grant-funding meeting. Request for funds will be accepted until November 27, 2020. Application blanks can be found on our website www.clearwater-polk.com, or from one of the committee members, Cindy Benson, Lois Rydeen or Laurie Pemberton. You may also contact our office to have a form mailed to you.

Donations from the Trust will generally be made to organizations which benefit the service area community of Clearwater-Polk Electric Cooperative. Non-profit Organizations which have been granted IRS Code 501© (3) status and serve a large number of people will be given priority.

### Donations from the Trust will generally not be made for:

- A. Lobbying, political and religious organizations
- B. Fraternal, and labor organizations
- C. Fund-raising dinners, raffles and other events
- D. Individuals
- E. National fund drives
- F. Advertising
- G. Economic development projects.

### The following factors will be considered in the evaluation of all funding requests.

- A. Potential benefit to area residents and the entire community;
- B. Level of community support for the program or project or organization requesting the funds;
- C. Fiscal and administrative capability of the organization to deliver a quality service or program; and
- D. Results that are predictable can be evaluated.
- All donations to organizations will be published in area newspapers and the Current Activities Newsletter.

All applications will be kept on hand for one year.

To maintain the reliability, quality and affordability of the services Clearwater-Polk Electric provides to their memberowners, it is sometimes necessary to implement rate adjustments. Your Co-op works hard to minimize the impact of necessary rate adjustments. Maintaining dependable service at an affordable price remains the cornerstone of your electric cooperative's business.

In December 2019 Clearwater-Polk contacted National Rural Utilities Cooperative Finance Corporation (CFC) to inquire about performing a Cost of Service Study. A cost of service study is a tool that utilities use to ensure that their rates are tied to their costs of providing electricity to their consumers. It involves analyzing historical expenses and projecting future cash flow needs to arrive at a revenue requirement. The collection of this data began in January of this year. After a few months that data collection was complete, and that analysis phase began.

As a result of the analysis of the cost of service study, in October, Clearwater-Polk Electric's Board of Directors approved a residential rate adjustment that will take effect on January 1, 2021. This decision was not made lightly and came after several months of research.

This rate adjustment will give a new look to the rate structure for Clearwater-Polk Electric's residential consumers. The changes include:

- 1) Changing the two-tier rate where the first 700 kWhs has been at .079 and the balance at .071 and making it one single rate at .115 per kWh.
- 2) Reducing the Power Cost Adjustment (PCA) calculation. Under the old calculation, the average PCA was .04280 per kWh. The new calculation will have an anticipated average of .00340 per kWh. This is a reduction of .0394 per kWh (kilowatt-hour). The new PCA calculation may result in a charge or a credit on member's bill statement.
- 3) A Demand Charge of \$0.60 per kW (kilowatt) will be implemented. This charge will be applied to the high demand reading for each month on main meters only. This charge will not be applied to heat meters.


Any 10 or more members who reside in the district, up for election, may nominate an eligible member for a director's position. No member may be elected to a director position unless nominated in this manner. In the event of a joint Membership, only the signature of one member shall be acceptable.

### WHAT IS REQUIRED OF A DIRECTOR?

The bylaws of Clearwater-Polk Electric Cooperative establish certain qualifications that must be met in order to become a director. These are:

- 1. Be a member in good standing of the Cooperative, receiving electric service at the member's primary residence in the district from which the director is elected prior to being nominated for director; provided, further that "primary residence" is defined as the residence that is the chief or main residence of the person and where the person actually lives for the most substantial portion of the year;
- Not be, nor within three (3) years preceding a director candidate's nomination have been, an employee of the Cooperative;
- Not be, become, nor shall have been at any time during the five (5) years preceding a director candidate's nomination, employed by a labor union which represents, or has represented, or has endeavored to represent any employee of the Cooperative;
- 4. Not be a close relative of an employee or director, where as found in these bylaws "close relative" means any individual who is, either by blood, law, or marriage, including half, step, foster, and adoptive relations, a spouse, child, grandchild, parent, grandparent, or sibling, or principally resides in the same residence;
- 5. Not be employed by, materially affiliated with, or have a

material financial interest in, any director, individual or entity which either is:

- (i) directly or substantially competing with the Cooperative; or
- (ii) selling goods and services in substantial quantity to the Cooperative; or
- (iii) possessing a substantial conflict of interest with the Cooperative.

For purposes of this section, the terms "material" or "substantially" shall be interpreted as constituting a minimum of 5% of a member's total hours of employment, sales, or income on an annual basis;

- Not be or become the full-time employee or agent of, or be or become the full-time employer or principal or, another director;
- Not be absent, without being excused by the board, from three (3) or more regular meetings of the board of directors during any twelve (12) month period;
- 8. Be only one, and not more than one, member of a joint membership; provided, however, that none shall be eligible to become or remain a director or to hold a position of trust in the Cooperative unless all shall meet the qualifications hereinabove set forth;
- 9. If a representative or agent of a member is not a natural person, i.e. a corporation, partnership, limited liability company, or similar, then the representative or agent designated as a nominee for director shall be an individual residing within the external boundaries of the district from which (s)he is nominated; and
- 10. Never have been convicted of a felony.

Changes that will be applied to the Residential and Commercial Generator accounts include a rate change from .043 per kWh plus the Power Cost Adjustment (average of .0328) to a per kWh rate of .076 with the new Power Cost Adjustment calculation the same as the residential rate (anticipated average of 0.00340 per kWh).

Large Power and 3-phase accounts will see the current average power cost adjustment of 0.0428 per kWh roll into their current energy rate and the new Power Cost Adjustment (anticipated average of 0.00340 per kWh) will be applied.

A strong concern for Clearwater-Polk implementing a rate adjustment is member-consumer's reaction. Clearwater-Polk must strike a balance between maintaining the high level of reliability, quality and overall satisfaction Clearwater-Polk Electric members have come to know and expect with protecting the integrity and financial stability of the organization.

This rate structure will provide the ability for Clearwater-Polk Electric to better promote the energy efficiency programs being implemented by the state and federal governments. This rate structure also has the potential to allow you as a consumer to better control your electric costs by modifying some of your usage patterns. The Cooperative anticipates an overall increase in revenue collected from rates of just under 3%. The average household member using approximately 1,350 kWhs may experience an estimated increase in their electric bill by 3.5%.

One area of energy efficiency is what we call our peak times. These typically occur early to mid-morning and in the late afternoon and early evening hours. These high usage times increase the demand on the generation plants and result in higher electric costs than any other time of the day. Here are some of the ways that you will be able to save under the proposed new rates.

New Rate

Refrigerators-Statistics show us that many of you have more than one refrigerator and that in some cases the second one is the old one from your kitchen, now located in the garage or elsewhere that isn't climate controlled. Manufacturers tell us that refrigerators made prior to 1993 use up to 5 times more electricity than current models. Now top that off by putting it in a hot garage during the summer and we can only guess how much it uses.

Laundry-Many of you are two income families that get home from work sometime in the late afternoon. You may start dinner and then throw in a load of laundry. It so happens that is the same thing many of your neighbors do, increasing the peak demand on the generation plants. Under the proposed new rates your bill could be lower if you would choose to do your laundry in the mornings or late at night. Each electric dryer uses approximately 5 kW of demand.

Watering-If you have a well, you could save by watering your garden or plants at some time other than between 4 to 9 p.m. during the summer.

Cooking-It takes a lot of energy to keep a stove hot when cooking food. Using the microwave or toaster oven saves, especially during that 4 to 9 p.m. time slot. A microwave uses approximately 1/8 of the electricity to heat food that your stove does. When your family does use the stove, keep the lids on the pots so energy doesn't escape. You could also use grills or other small cooking appliances outdoors during the summer to reduce the amount of heat created inside the house.

Dishwashing-Using your dishwasher at times other than the 4 to 9 p.m. time slot would not only save on your dishwasher demand, but on your hot water heater demand too, if it is electric.

## ELECTRICAL SAFETY TIPS FOR HUNTERS

This hunting season, we encourage all members to be aware of electrical equipment and take necessary precautions while hunting. Keep these safety tips in mind as you enjoy the great outdoors.



- Take notice of posted warning signs and keep clear of electric equipment.
- Do not shoot at or near power lines or insulators.
- Know where power lines and equipment are located on the land where you hunt.
- Be especially careful in wooded areas where power lines may not be as visible.
- Do not place deer stands on utility poles or climb poles. Energized lines and equipment can conduct electricity to anyone who comes in contact with them, causing shock or electrocution.
- Do not place decoys on power lines or other utility equipment. Any nonelectrical equipment attached to a pole can pose an obstruction and serious hazards to our line crews.
